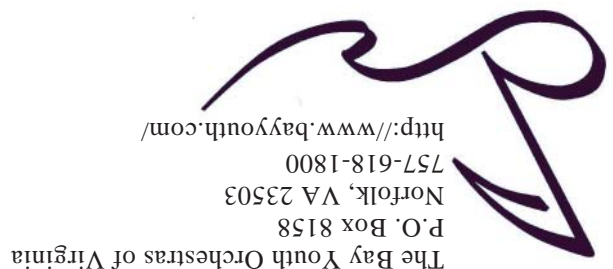
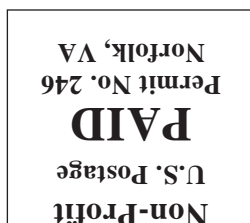

I am quite excited about my new position with Bay Youth Orchestra. It is wonderful to receive so much support from the board, the members and the parents. I plan on doing everything I can to make a successful year for the entire Bay Youth Organization. As you read this article, I would like you to think of ways that you can become more involved with BYO. We have such wonderful parents who have contacts throughout this region. Perhaps you can help spread the word to increase the size of our audience or increase the interest in students auditioning for the ensembles. Perhaps you can help with finding corporate sponsors and new advertisers for our program book. We need volunteers to pass out programs, sell tickets and flowers, and monitor rehearsal rooms. We are in need of a group of parents to sell snacks at rehearsals (this is incredibly important for the students). Please let us know how you can help at the beginning of the year. This organization will be stronger with your volunteered support.

“The Elements”

Thanks to our creative Executive Director, Bob Spaeth, we have a wonderful title for the 2007-2008 Season. We will be exploring music inspired by the elements: earth, water, wind and fire. Earlier last year, Chris Morton thought it would be a great idea to collaborate with a Chesapeake Bay restoration group and Beth Argiro has a contact with the Back Bay Restoration Foundation. Our February Concert will be devoted to “Water” and the preservation of one of our most treasured bodies of water: The Chesapeake Bay. You will not want to miss this concert.

Water has inspired many composers and when I was thinking of music for the first concert titled “Earth”, water themes kept bubbling to the surface. The first concert will feature “The Moldau” by Bedric Smetana. The Moldau is part of a large tone poem that describes the Czech countryside with music. You will hear Smetana’s depiction of a river gurgling at its beginning, passing a country wedding scene, traveling through a storm and showing its beautiful expanse through the countryside.

The first half of our season will also be dominated by the extraordinary music of Tchaikovsky. The Virginia Symphony has invited the Bay Youth Symphony Orchestra to perform on two side-by-side concerts featuring this passionate Russian composer. We will be performing a few movements of the ballet scores for “Swan Lake”, “Sleeping Beauty” and “The Nutcracker”. The students will also get to know Tchaikovsky’s Symphony No. 6 and 1812 Overture. This is an invaluable experience for our young musicians and a wonderful chance to build community awareness.

The Concerto Competition is open for all Bay Youth Symphony members and is taking place on December 15.

We have very talented players in our orchestra who will get a chance to shine during this competition. Only two members will be chosen this year to solo with the orchestra in March. Carnival Overture by Antonin Dvorak will be the final piece on that program. Finishing the year ‘con fuoco’ (with fire), the BYSO will perform Ritual Fire Dance by Manuel de Falla and the famous Berceuse and Finale from Stravinsky’s ballet score “The Firebird”.

I have planned music that I love and I know the students will enjoy learning. They are not easy pieces and the students will need to be prepared for rehearsals. Listening is the key to understanding this music. I highly recommend listening to professional recordings of these pieces. Students and parents can go to Planet Music and find several recordings, or you can download recordings from your favorite site. By listening to recordings, you can gain a total concept of the piece and you will understand how your part fits into the entire work. This is a wonderful organization and I can’t wait for the new season to start!
